**ORDER DENYING
MOTION FOR TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER**

The plaintiff, George Stanley, who is unrepresented, has filed a complaint alleging a deprivation of civil rights pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1981. He contends that he has been forcibly prevented from entering the Social Security Administration office located in Auburn, Maine. He further contends that when he was in the office, staff members were, among other things, “rude, insolent[, and] impatient,” and that he was refused service. His complaint requests a judgment ordering that he be permitted to enter the Auburn office and given access to all Social Security Administration services; that the Social Security Administration staff be enjoined from treating him improperly; and that he be awarded damages, including punitive damages.

Stanley has also moved for a Temporary Restraining Order. His motion is supported by his complaint, but no other documents. Neither the complaint, which is not verified, nor the motion, which is not under oath,

indicate that the State has received notification of his Motion for a Temporary Restraining Order pursuant to the provisions of Rule 65(b) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure. Furthermore, Stanley has not presented “specific facts in an affidavit or a verified complaint [that] clearly show that immediate and irreparable injury, loss, or damage will result to [him] before the adverse party can be heard in opposition.” Fed. R. Civ. P. 65(b)(1)(A).

Accordingly, having carefully considered Stanley’s motion for a temporary restraining order, it is hereby ORDERED that the motion is DENIED.
