**ORDER ON PLAINTIFF’S RESPONSE TO SHOW CAUSE ORDER AND
MOTION TO RECONSIDER**

Michael Doyle, personal representative of the Estate of Marion Doyle, has submitted a Response to Show Cause Order and Motion to Reconsider (hereinafter, “Motion to Reconsider”) dated June 30, 2015, which was filed with the court on July 6, 2015. ECF No. 48. He asks that the court grant him additional time to search for an attorney to represent him in his capacity as personal representative, or that he be permitted to represent himself in that capacity. *Id.* at 3.

On May 22, 2015, the court entered its Order to Show Cause as a result of Doyle’s failure to have an attorney appear in this action. ECF No. 44 at 2. The Order to Show Cause required “that Michael Doyle, Personal Representative of the Estate of Marion Doyle, must show cause within 30 days why this action should not be dismissed for want of prosecution.” *Id.* Doyle failed to respond to the court’s Order to Show Cause. Accordingly, on June 24, 2015, the court entered its Order dismissing

the case, *see* ECF No. 45, and a judgment was entered in favor of defendants on June 25, 2015, *see* ECF No. 47.

Doyle has failed to present grounds that support the reconsideration of the judgment entered in this case. His Motion to Reconsider does not explain why he failed to respond to the May 22 Order within 30 days. *See* ECF No. 48 at 1-3. Further, the motion does not state grounds that would support a grant of relief from judgment pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 60(b). *Id.* Finally, the claims that Doyle wishes to pursue on behalf of the Estate are virtually identical to those he asserted in his individual capacity, which were fully briefed by the parties and considered by the court, and were ordered dismissed. *See* ECF No. 33.

Accordingly, the Motion to Reconsider is **ORDERED** denied.
