ORDER ESTABLISHING COLLATERAL FORFEITURE SCHEDULE FOR CERTAIN
PETTY TITLE 8 OFFENSES

It appearing that violations of Title 8, United States Code, Sections 1304(e), 1306(a) and 1306(b) occur in the jurisdiction of the Court and that the collateral forfeiture amounts proposed by the Government are reasonable and consistent with the statutory penalties and amounts imposed in other districts, and it further appearing that it would be for the benefit and convenience of all concerned that (1) the United States Border Patrol be authorized to issue violation notices to be processed through the Central Violations Bureau for the specified offenses, (2) a plan be established whereby persons committing these offenses may dispose of said cases by forfeiture of collateral in a fixed amount, and subject to a processing fee established by the Central Violations Bureau, without the necessity of appearing before a United States Magistrate Judge at Bangor or Portland, Maine, it is:

ORDERED, as follows:

1. That any U.S. Border Patrol Agent authorized to make arrests or issue violation notices in the District of Maine for offenses appearing in the attached Schedule, may issue a Violation Notice for offenses appearing in said Schedule in the form provided by law.
2. When a U.S. Border Patrol Agent issues a Violation Notice, the Agent or other agent or employee of the U.S. Border Patrol shall, within a reasonable period of time,

forward a copy of the Violation Notice to the Central Violations Bureau at P.O. Box 780549, San Antonio, Texas 78278-0549.

3. All collateral remitted by offenders in accordance with this plan and any processing fee required by the Central Violations Bureau shall be sent to the Central Violations Bureau along with a copy of the Violation Notice.
4. Nothing in this Order shall restrict the authority of a U.S. Border Patrol Agent to lawfully arrest an offender.
5. This Order shall continue in effect pending further Order of this Court.

FORFEITURE OF COLLATERAL SCHEDULE

STATUTE	OFFENSE	FORFEITURE OF COLLATERAL
8 U.S.C. 1304(e)	Failure to Carry Alien Registration	\$80.00
8 U.S.C. 1306(a)	Willful Failure to Register	\$80.00
8 U.S.C. 1306(b)	Failure to Notify Change of Address	\$80.00

The offender shall also be required to pay a processing fee set by the Central Violations Bureau for each ticket. As of November 18, 2019, that processing fee is currently set at \$30 per ticket.
